




	<b>CUE TYPE</b>	<b>WHAT YOU'LL DO</b>	<b>EXAMPLE (DOG)</b>
	Sound cue	Provide the first sound(s) of a word. Use the actual sounds, not the letter names.	“d_____” or “do_”
	Description cue	Provide a description of the word.	“People keep it as a pet” “It barks.”
	Sentence or phrase completion	Provide a fill-in-the-blank option with a phrase or sentence.	“Pet the...” “Not a cat, but a...” (opposite) “It’s raining cats and...” (common phrase)
	Multiple choice	Provide two or more options. Providing options that are related may be more difficult than options that are unrelated.	“Dog or rabbit?” (related) “Sunshine or dog?” (unrelated)
	Modeling	Say the word out loud so it can be repeated.	“Say dog.”
	Writing	Provide written cues, such as writing down: <b>1st letter of the word</b> <b>Part of the word</b> <b>The whole word</b>	Example 1: d _ _ Example 2: do _ Example 3: <u>dog</u>
